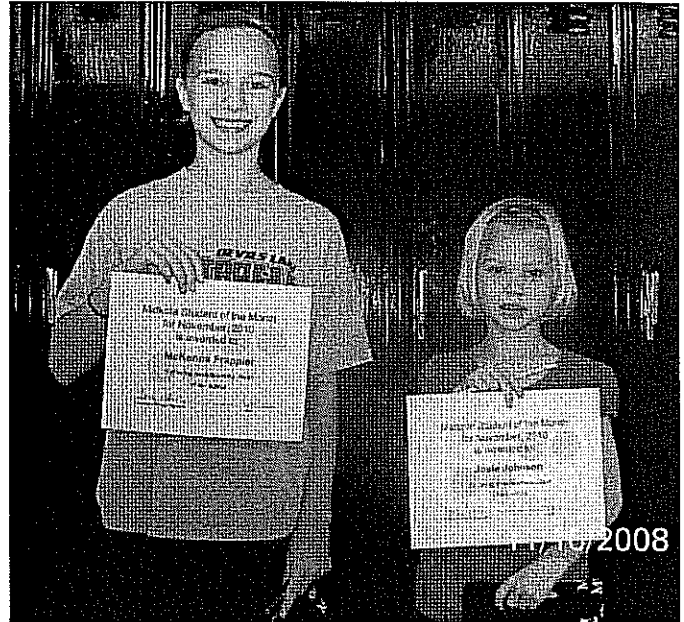

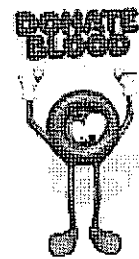

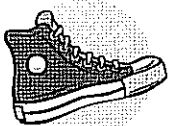
DISTRICT FOOD PANTRY DRIVE

Glenfield.



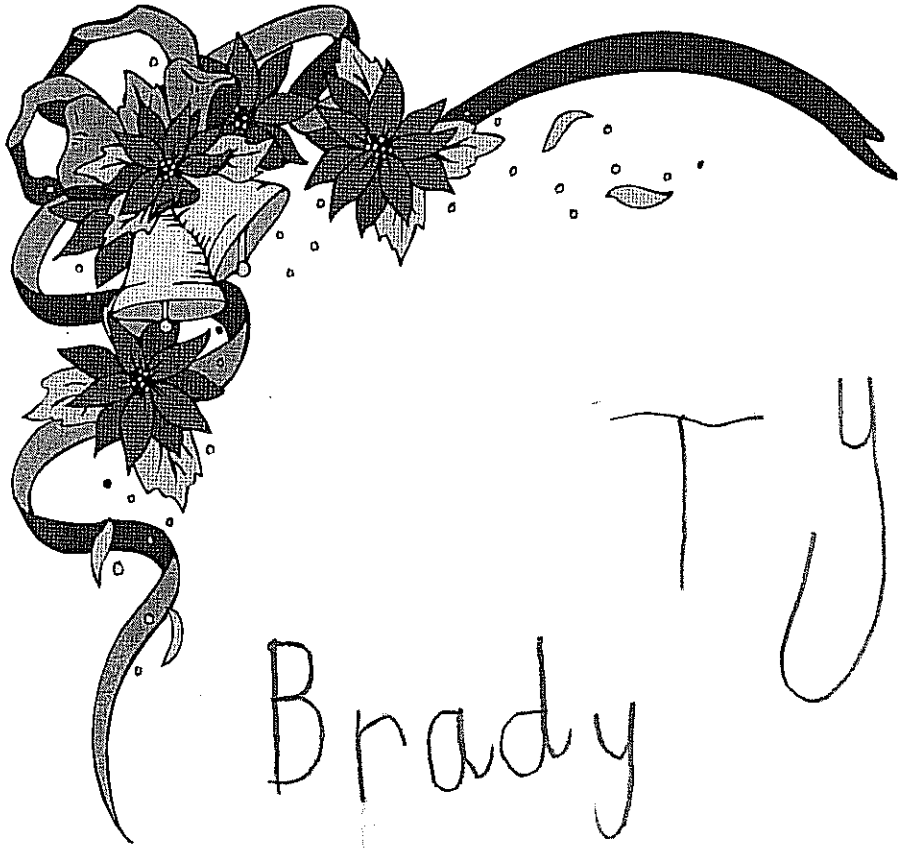
